Record Keeper's Role in the Club

Serving as a club record keeper means you are responsible for documenting who participates in each meeting and contest. It is very important that you keep accurate records, so that there is never a question about the number of checks a member has. It is also very important that the classroom chart is kept up to date, neat and organized. Do not total the numbers of check marks on the chart, this is the 4-H Staff Member's responsibility.

Day of the Clover

Day of the Clover is a recognition event held at the end of the club year to recognize outstanding 4-H participation. A 4-H member must earn a minimum of seven check marks to be eligible to receive an invitation to Day of the Clover. The accuracy on the participation chart is the most important part of your job!
