## Steps in 4-H Public Speaking

**PLAN** - Select any subject. Select a topic you like and know something about. As you begin planning your speech, you should select a subject and begin to research it for information. Get information from teachers, parents, books, news articles, etc. Do not make up information.

**ORGANIZE** - Make an outline; then write your speech using the three basic parts of a speech.

Introduction - Introduce your subject. Get the audience's attention. Ideas for attention getters are alliteration, asking a question, quotes, facts, catchy phrase, onomatopoeia, etc.

**Body** – Use three major points in your speech. Tell only the facts in a logical order.

**Conclusion** - Emphasize again the main points of your speech, perhaps by using the opening phrase again.

**PRACTICE** - Over and over! NO VISUALS should be used. Stand straight and remember that a deep breath at the beginning will help you to relax. Stand on both feet, one slightly forward. Look at the audience and be descriptive. Smile as you speak loudly, clearly, distinctly, and slowly. If notes are needed, use cards or small pieces of paper. Practice in front of a mirror and/or video yourself. Most of all enjoy speaking

## WHEN GIVING A SPEECH

Use hand gestures
Skim cards... Do not read from cards
Straight back... good posture
Use body language to support main points
Keep feet on tape spot
Try and not sway
Speak loudly, clearly, and fluently
Eyes on audience
